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Flims Laax Falera. History & Brands.

The destination of Flims Laax Falera originally developed from summer tourism, with Flims and Lake Cauma at the very centre. Later, the region developed into a popular winter destination, with the centre shifting up the mountain to LAAX and the Crap Sogn Gion mountain station. The destination offers a variety of year-round tourism offers to different target groups – whether in winter or summer. In this way, the destination's potential is fully exploited.


The destination's brand strategy uses the strengths of the two brands, Flims and LAAX, all year round. While Flims is renowned for hiking, culture and nature, and is perceived as the quieter location, LAAX, on the other hand, represents action, adventure and community and is seen as the louder of the two villages. This strategy reflects the tradition and history of the multifaceted destination Flims Laax Falera and uses authentic brand names that relate to the region. The Weisse Arena Group, founded in 1996, is responsible for the year-round marketing of the destination.

Weisse Arena Group. The Company Behind the Resort.

The Weisse Arena Group, based in Laax, Graubünden, was formed in 1996 through the merger of the Crap Sogn Gion Ski Lift Company in Laax and the Flims Ski Lift Company in Flims.

The business model of the Weisse Arena Group, with its six wholly owned subsidiaries and numerous brands, is unique in the Alpine region. The group includes a ski lift company, various hotel and restaurant businesses, sports and rental shops, a ski, snowboard and bike school, as well as a management and construction company.

As an integrated service provider in the tourism and leisure industry, the group is responsible not only for the operation of the winter sports area, but also for the year-round marketing of the entire destination of Flims Laax Falera. Learn more



Flims Laax Falera. The Winter Destination.

More than just winter holidays.

Winter sports enthusiasts can look forward to 224 kilometres of pistes with a mix of blue, red and black runs. Over 70 per cent of pistes are between 2,000 and 3,000 metres above sea level, making LAAX one of the most snow-sure ski areas in Switzerland. 28 modern lifts take guests quickly up the mountain.

Action-hungry skiers also have five snowparks, an Olympicsized pro kicker line, a minipipe and the world's largest halfpipe at their disposal for their enjoyment.

Away from the slopes and parks, LAAX also has three toboggan runs, 62 kilometres of double-tracked cross-country ski trails and around 100 kilometres of winter hiking trails.

Digital forerunner in tourism.

LAAX has also been an industry pioneer in terms of digitalisation for years: as one of the first winter sports resorts, online bookings were introduced back in the 90s, the interactive LAAX app was launched in 2015, and area-wide Wifi was also installed on the mountain. With over 435,000 users, the app has successfully established itself and has proven to be a useful companion for tourists in the destination.

In winter 2018/19, the network operator Sunrise also launched the first standardised 5G network in a winter sports region on Crap Sogn Gion (2,252 m above sea level), a world premiere in LAAX. Learn more

FlemXpress gondola lift

After 15 years of planning, the dream becomes reality: the new gondola lift in Flims, the FlemXpress, is under construction with the first two sections opening in December 2023. The FlemXpress is a fully automatic and on-demand gondola lift with several stations that leads from Flims to the Tectonic Arena Sardona UNESCO Natural World Heritage Site. The new technology called "Ropetaxi" was developed specifically for this project by the Weisse Arena Group and the company Bartholet Maschinenbau AG and exists nowhere else in the world. If no gondolas are occupied, they are not on the track. They are instead parked in the stations waiting to be called like a taxi. Passengers simply select one of five stations where they want to get off, then their gondola arrives moving autonomously in the station and brings them to their destination.






For Action Lovers. Upside Down in LAAX.



LAAX OPEN FIS Snowboard & Freeski World Cup

From 16 to 21 January 2024, the world's best freestyle snowboarders and skiers will compete in the park and in the superpipe at Crap Sogn Gion. The LAAX OPEN is one of the biggest and most renowned freestyle contests in the world and part of the FIS World Cup Tour.



KIDS LAAX OPEN

Switzerland's biggest freestyle contest for kids and teenagers will take place from 16 to 17 March 2024. Over 350 kids from more than 17 countries participate each year in the disciplines snowboard halfpipe and slopestyle as well as ski halfpipe and slopestyle.



Background: Climate Change in the Alps.

Anyone understandably concerned with climate change in Europe inevitably takes a look at the Alpine region. There, temperatures have risen twice as much as the global average over the last 100 years. According to a forecast by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, the snow season will shorten by one to two days every two years. This development can already be observed: whereas only a few years ago, guests could rely on an early start to the season at the end of October, today the snow often doesn't fall until November.

This is also noticeable in LAAX: the snow line has risen and the snow comes later. For regions known for their winter sports tourism, the changing climate conditions are a challenge. As a winter sports destination, LAAX is aware of its responsibility towards the environment and nature, because future generations should still be able to enjoy wide, perfectly groomed slopes and white snowy landscapes in the winter months.

Our Motto. Reduce. Reuse. Recycle.

Since 2008, the entire electricity demand of the Weisse Arena Group has been covered 100% by renewable energy from Switzerland. However, not only the Weisse Arena Group, but the entire destination of Flims Laax Falera is pursuing an ambitious goal: to transform from an energy consumer to a producer and cover 100% of the destination's energy needs with climate-friendly, regional sources.

In order to achieve this vision, a special sustainability concept called "Greenstyle" was implemented in 2010. Since then, numerous larger and smaller measures for environmental protection have been implemented annually according to the guiding principle "reduce, reuse, recycle". All these measures were summarised in the "Greenstyle Book" published in 2022 and thus made accessible to the public at a glance.

We prepare slopes energy-efficiently

All of LAAX has been digitally mapped to the centimetre. The destination therefore knows exactly where snow lies. Piste machine drivers and the snowmaking team can work more economically and ensure that technical snow is only made in the necessary places.



We convert our buildings

The greatest potential for energy-saving measures lies in existing buildings. Plusenergy buildings produce more energy than they draw from the outside. The energy required for heating and hot water is generated in or on the building itself, e.g. through solar and photovoltaic systems.

How We Involve Our Guests.

Clean-Up Day.

Our piste patrollers can tell us a thing or two about how much rubbish is revealed under the melting snow in spring. For guests who would like to make their contribution to a clean environment in LAAX, a public Clean-Up Day takes place every year in June.

On this day, everyone from the destination, including guests, work together to protect and preserve local nature. In groups and equipped with rubbish bags, they go into the area together and free the winter sports area from carelessly discarded rubbish and equipment that has been left lying around.
